

CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL (CMA)

ADDENDUM: The 2017-2018 CMA goal for the SKT-LMC is \$30,799, a substantial increase from last year's goal. Parish or Community goals are calculated using these statistics: number of households, weekly Mass attendance, ordinary offertory, and median income. The Diocesan Office of Stewardship and Communications thus determines CMA goals. The SKT-LMC put in an appeal to our assigned goal, explaining our financial position at present. However, the Office did not grant our request for a reduction in the goal, citing the difficulties that many (other) parishes face. We are not alone in facing financial challenges! Its theme this year is "Glorifying the Lord by Our Lives." Hopefully those who are registered members of the SKT-LMC have received the CMA mailing (letter and pledge card). Extra copies are available on the ushers' tables inside the church doors. In order for the SKT-LMC to be properly credited for your gift, make sure the number "400" is on the Donor I.D. line of the return envelope. The Name of Parish line should read "SKT Latin Mass Community", and checks are payable to "CMA". The CMA offers each of us an opportunity to support the mission of the Diocesan Church. Every gift is needed and important. If it is easier, you can make your gift at www.dor.org and you can also pay your pledge in installments. Pledge forms can be put in the Sunday collection basket or mailed directly to the Diocese. You are urged to participate once again this year. Thank you in advance.

This year we celebrated the 25th anniversary of Eucharistic Adoration at the St. Thomas the Apostle Chapel adjacent to the parish center. Faithful volunteers have been involved in getting substitutes for open hours for four years now. Initially the list of substitutes contained 62 names. It is now down to 31. We have 20 hours open each week. 14 people have accepted regular hours, in the last 4 years. The chapel is open 65 hours each week. We have many people who make drop in visits.

The Chapel is a beautiful quiet, peaceful place. We all need that in order to think and pray. We have many intentions, including our children. Bring them to Chapel in your hearts, if they don't go to Mass. It is a beautiful place to say the rosary which Our Lady requested. Please come!

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH, please turn OFF all cell phones, handheld electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It *is* possible for messaging and texting to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE: Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: *neatly* and *modestly*. Holy Mass is <u>not</u> an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT

for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION **NOT COMMOTION**. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!!

SPEAKING OF CHURCH ETIQUETTE...

...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary).
