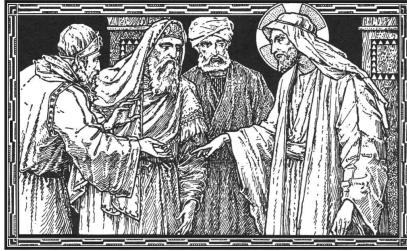

HELPING OUR NEIGHBORS IN NEED

Each Sunday throughout the year, SKT-LMC collects donations of non-perishable food items for local food cupboards, for the purpose of alleviating hunger caused by poverty in our area. FAITH FORMATION

Our classes are underway and will continue every Sunday until November 20th. If you would still like to enroll your child we are still accepting applicants. We provide consistent, orthodox instruction to students in Kindergarten through High School. Enrolling your children with us gives them the gift of classical teaching styles, low teacher to student ratios, a chance for making friends with other children and families in our midst, and is another way you can support the SKT-LMC. WHAT IS APOLOGETICS? As you are hopefully aware, one way that we are expanding our Faith Formation Program is in the inclusion of a course in Catholic Apologetics. It is a course that is available to students that have been confirmed up to age 21. Apologetics comes from the Greek word *Apologia*, which means “in defense of a teaching”. In today’s age, it’s definition is “The science of explaining the Catholic Faith in a rational and reasonable manner with love and patience.” Our course will explore at a far deeper level what the Church teaches through Tradition and Scripture so we can defend our Faith as conversations arise with Atheists, Non-Christians, Protestants, and even dissenting Catholics. Our students will be able to answer important questions about Early Teachings on Infant Baptism, Mary’s Perpetual Virginity, why we pray to the Saints and to the Blessed Mother, Purgatory, Salvation and so much more. It will be an incredibly valuable course that I am so proud to bring to our Community. We all know the dangers that surround our children on a daily basis and those dangers are so prevalent around college campuses today. Our mission in our Faith Formation Program is to, in partnership with parents, create life-long Catholics that live their Faith to the end of their days. ADORATION CHAPEL

THE EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL, adjacent to the Parish Center, must continue to be a very important powerhouse of prayer *and* place of spiritual refuge for us *and* for people in our area. Currently, we have 17 hours of adoration that are open. Recently three men and a couple accepted a regular Adoration hour.

We also need substitutes to fill hours that are temporarily open. Substitutes can indicate a day and hour they would be available.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH, please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It *is* possible for messaging and texting to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE: Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: *neatly* and *modestly*. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION **NOT** COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!!

SPEAKING OF CHURCH ETIQUETTE...

...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary).

Annual Blue Mass

The Most Reverend Salvatore R. Matano, Bishop of Rochester, will preside at the Annual Blue Mass for members of law enforcement on Sunday, October 16, 2016. The Mass will be held at Sacred Heart Cathedral at 11:15 a.m. All are welcome to attend to pray for these brave men and women who daily risk their lives to protect our community. Representatives from local, county, state and federal law enforcement agencies throughout our community will attend the Mass. Sacred Heart Cathedral is located at 296 Flower City Park, between Dewey and Lake avenues, in Rochester.

Upcoming celebrations at the Holy Door of Mercy at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Rochester

November 2, 2016 6:30 p.m. Mass for All Souls Day, followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and individual confessions until 8 p.m. Homily: "Through the Mercy of God, may they rest in peace." Bishop Matano, celebrant.

November 4, 2016 6:30 p.m. Mass for First Friday, followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions until 8 p.m.

November 20, 2016 Closing of the Holy Door of Mercy at the 5 p.m. Mass. Bishop Matano, celebrant.

Pope Francis has declared that passing through the Holy Door of Mercy, located in our Diocese at the inside center entrance of the Cathedral, will offer the possibility of obtaining a Plenary Indulgence, a remission of the temporal punishment due to sins, by participating in the Sacraments of Confession and Holy Eucharist, praying for the Holy Father's personal intentions, and praying the Profession of Faith (the Creed).
