

THE 2018-2019 CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL (CMA) UPDATE

As of November 16th, we have pledged \$20,490 out of our goal of \$32,320 or 63%. This commitment is from 30 parishioners or approximately 10% of our total 304 registered families. As you can see we still have a way to go to reach our ultimate goal. However, this can easily be accomplished if all LMC parishioners contribute whatever possible to the campaign. It would be wonderful if this can be accomplished by December 31st. Remember if we do not meet our goal, we still have the obligation to pay the diocese for any shortfall. This amount will have to come out of our operating account. If we exceed our goal, the Diocese will give back to the parish 50% of the excess pledges that are paid. This is a big incentive to meet and possibly exceed our goal. As a reminder, when you mail in your pledge cards or envelopes please make sure that our **parish number 400** is indicated. You can also drop your pledge in the Sunday collection.

CMA GIVING OPTIONS: ATTENTION, SENIORS!

This is one option that you can consider when making your contribution to the CMA campaign for 2018. For those of you who are $70 \, 1/2$ or older and are required to take your annual contribution from your IRA, you can designate your annual contribution from your IRA as part of your required minimum distribution. This is an easy way to meet your pledge. The IRS allows for an individual who is required to take their annual IRA distributions to contribute up to \$100,000 annually to charitable qualified organizations. You will need to let your wealth advisor know that you want to make a contribution to the CMA from your IRA. You will need to tell them who to make the check payable to and the amount. The check should be made payable to CMA. You will also need to make sure that they note on the check the following: 400-Latin Mass Community and the acct. # that is on your pledge card that you received from the Diocese. If you do not have an account number your name and address and the parish number should suffice. The benefit of doing this is that you can consider it part of your required minimum IRA distribution and that it will not be a taxable event to you. You will just need to let your tax advisor know that you made a charitable distribution from your IRA for 2018 and the amount. The tax law changes for 2018 have eliminated most of our itemized deductions and have increased the standard deductions as an offset. Therefore, you will reduce your taxable income by contributing to your favorite charities through your IRA. This must be completed by December 31st. In addition to the CMA, you can also make your annual pledges to SKT-LMC through your annual You must be 70 1/2 or older and must be taking your required annual required distributions. distributions. The Diocese is aware of this method. They have other parishioners who make their contribution to the CMA through their IRA's. If you have any questions please feel free to call Bill May at 544-7604

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH, please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It *is* possible for messaging and texting to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE: Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: *neatly* and *modestly*. Holy Mass is <u>not</u> an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION **NOT COMMOTION**. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!!

SPEAKING OF CHURCH ETIQUETTE...

...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it becomes necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
