

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are spiritually prepared (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a worthy Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary before the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

THE FIRST READING Acts 14:21-27

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

Then I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth. The former heaven and the former earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them as their God. The One who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."

When Judas had left them, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him. If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and God will glorify him at once. My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

GOSPEL John 16, 5-14

Just because I have said this to you, your hearts are full of sorrow. Still, I am telling you the truth: it is better for you that I go away. If I do not go, the Paraclete will never come to you; whereas, if I do go, I shall send him to you. And when he does come, he will prove the world wrong about sin, about justice, about condemnation. First, sin-because they refuse to believe in me. Then, justice-because I am going to the Father and you can no longer see me. Finally, condemnation-because the Prince of this world has been condemned. I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. When he comes, however, being the Spirit of Truth, he will guide you along the way of all truth. For he will not speak on his own, but will speak only what he hears and will announce to you the things to come. He will glorify me because he will take what is mine and announce it to you." **OFFERTORY** Shout joyfully to God, all you on earth, sing praise to the glory of his name; hear now, all you who fear God, while I declare what the Lord has done for me, alleluia.

To provide a solution to the property dilemma:




