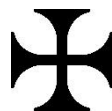

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

CATHOLIC COUPLES in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

2022/2023 CMA INFORMATION We recently received our goal for the upcoming CMA campaign. Our goal was increased from \$34,617 to \$47,000. This is an increase of \$12,382 or 35%. We filed a strong appeal with the Diocese on why we felt this increase was not justified. In responding to our appeal, the Diocese did not change our goal, but they did forgive the \$4,164 shortfall that we would have owed them from our recent 2021/2022 CMA goal. This savings will be put aside as a down payment on the upcoming year CMA. We wanted to share this matter with each of you as we move forward into the fall CMA campaign. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.

GLORIA Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE FIRST READING Gn 18:1-10

The LORD appeared to Abraham by the terebinth of Mamre, as he sat in the entrance of his tent, while the day was growing hot. Looking up, Abraham saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them; and bowing to the ground, he said: "Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant. Let some water be brought, that you may bathe your feet, and then rest yourselves under the tree. Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way." The men replied, "Very well, do as you have said." Abraham hastened into the tent and told Sarah, "Quick, three measures of fine flour! Knead it and make rolls." He ran to the herd, picked out a tender, choice steer, and gave it to a servant, who quickly prepared it. Then Abraham got some curds and milk, as well as the steer that had been prepared, and set these before the three men; and he waited on them under the tree while they ate. They asked Abraham, "Where is your wife Sarah?" He replied, "There in the tent." One of them said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah will then have a son."

THE SECOND READING Col 1:24-28

Brothers and sisters: Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church, of which I am a minister in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past. But now it has been manifested to his holy ones, to whom God chose to make known the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; it is Christ in you, the hope for glory. It is he whom we proclaim, admonishing everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone perfect in Christ.

GOSPEL Lk 10:38-42

Jesus entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN*. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Lord is the strength of his people, the saving refuge of his anointed. Save your people, O Lord, and bless your inheritance; and rule them forever! To you, O Lord, I call; O my God, be not deaf to me, lest, if you heed me not, I become one of those going down into the pit. Glory be to the Father. The Lord.

PRAYER O mighty God, author of every good thing, implant in our hearts a deep love of your name. Support and protect us with your loving care so that we may be filled with a true spirit of devotion and sincere virtue. Through Jesus Christ.

EPISTLE Rom. 6, 3-11

Brethren: All of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death. By baptism into his death we were buried together with him, in order that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with him by likeness to his death, so shall we be united with him by likeness to his resurrection. We know this: our old self was crucified with him, so that the sinful body might be destroyed and we might no longer be slaves of sin. For a man who is dead has been freed from sin. If we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall live together with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, will never die again; death has no more power over him. His death was a death to sin, once for all; but his life is life for God. So you also must regard yourselves as dead to sin, but living for God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOSPEL Mark 8, 1-9

At that time a large crowd was present with Jesus, and again they had nothing to eat. So he summoned the disciples and told them, "My heart is moved to pity for the crowd. For three days now they have been in my company and have nothing left to eat. And if I send them home hungry, they will become weak on the way. Some of them, you know, have come a long distance." But his disciples replied, "How could anyone satisfy these people with bread here in this isolated spot?" Still he asked them, "How many loaves do you have?" "Seven," they replied. Then he directed the crowd to take their places on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, he gave thanks, broke them, and gave them to his disciples to distribute; and they distributed them to the crowd. They also had a few tiny fish; and blessing them, he told them to distribute them also. They ate until they were full. Then they gathered up seven hampers of fragments. There were about four thousand in number, and he dismissed them.

COMMUNION I will go round and offer in his tent sacrifices with shouts of gladness; I will sing and chant praise to the Lord.

POST COMMUNION O Lord, may we be cleansed and strengthened by the power and assistance of your gifts, with which we have been filled. Through Jesus Christ.

PRAYER TO ST JOSEPH by St. Francis de Sales

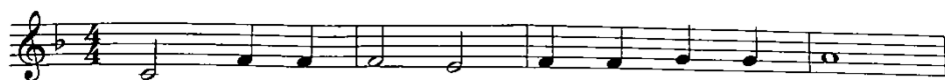
(To provide a solution to the property dilemma:)

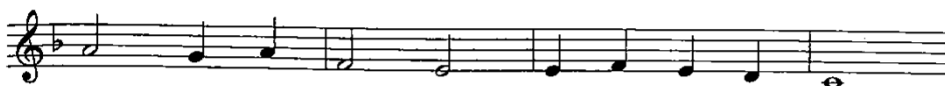
THE SAINT MICHAEL PRAYER (Pope Leo XIII)

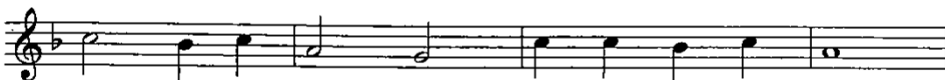
