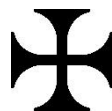

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

CATHOLIC COUPLES in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

WEEKLY NOTICES

WE ARE IN THE FULL SWING OF SUMMER... When hot weather brings the 'temptation' to dress scantily for the sake of comfort. But we do know that it is possible to dress for Holy Mass appropriately, comfortably, and modestly at the same time especially in an air-conditioned church. No short pants or skirts, please. Shoulders should be covered. Flip-flops are to be avoided. Let's not forget that we are NOT at a picnic, tennis match, or beach party. We are in the House of God and how we present ourselves for worship does matter. Thank you for your willing cooperation.

THE FIRST READING Wis 18:6-9

The night of the passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage. Your people awaited the salvation of the just and the destruction of their foes. For when you punished our adversaries, in this you glorified us whom you had summoned. For in secret the holy children of the good were offering sacrifice and putting into effect with one accord the divine institution.

THE SECOND READING Heb 11:1-2, 8-12

Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age—and Sarah herself was sterile—for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

GOSPEL Lk 12:35-40

Jesus said to his disciples: "Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have the servants recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN*. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON Ps. 53,6-7

Behold, God is my helper, the Lord sustains my life. Turn back the evil upon my foes; in your faithfulness destroy them, O Lord, my protector. O God, by your name save me, and by your might deliver me. Glory be to the Father. Behold.

PRAYER O Lord, in your mercy hear the prayers of those who call upon you. May they ask only what is pleasing to you, so that their requests may always be heard. Through Jesus Christ.

EPISTLE Rom. 6, 19-23

Brethren: We should not desire evil things as our fathers did. Do not become idolators as some of them did, as it is written: "the people sat down to eat and drink, and they got up to play." Let us not give ourselves up to immorality, as some of them did, so that in one day twenty-three thousand perished. Let us not test the Lord as some of them put him to the test and were destroyed by the serpents. And do not grumble as some of them grumbled and were killed by the destroying angel. Now these things overtook them to serve as an example. And they have been written down as a warning to us, who are living in the end of the ages. So then, let him who thinks he is standing firm, watch out that he does not fall. No test has been sent you that doesn't come to all men. Moreover, God keeps his promise. He will not let you be tested beyond your strength. He will give you with the test a way of emerging from it successfully, that you may be able to endure it.

GOSPEL Matthew 7: 15-21

At that time when Jesus was near, within sight of the city, he wept over it, saying, "If only you too had known this day the way to peace. But, as it is, it is hidden from your eyes. For days will come upon you and your enemies will encircle you with a rampart; they will invest you, and press you in on every side; they will wipe you out, you and your children within your walls, and they will not leave in you a stone upon a stone, because you failed to recognize the moment of your visitation." Then he entered the Temple precincts and began ejecting the traders, saying to them: "It is written, 'My house shall be a house of prayer'; but you have made it 'a bandits' den'." He was teaching daily in the Temple.

OFFERTORY The precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart, and his ordinances sweeter than syrup or honey from the comb; therefore your servant is careful of them.

SECRET May we celebrate these sacred rites worthily, O Lord, for each offering of this memorial sacrifice carries on the work of our redemption. Through Jesus Christ.

POST COMMUNION O Lord, may the reception of your blessed sacrament cleanse us from sin and make us one. Through Jesus Christ.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.

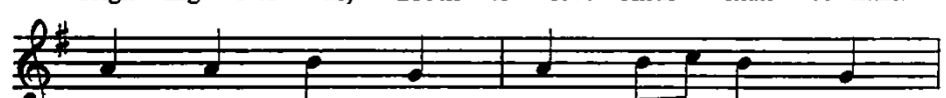

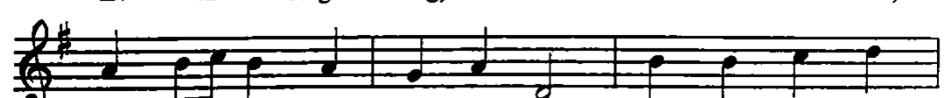
