### GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

**CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER** the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

**CATHOLIC COUPLES** in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

We are in the process of reviewing parking lot bids and will be scheduling restriping and pothole repairs in the very near future. Professional landscaping has been done around Msgr. Burns' grave – be sure to stop there often to seek his intercession for all your needs. We have collected half of the money we need to complete the painting on the Adoration Chapel outdoor trim. We are confident this project can be completed before the snow flies. There have been a few issues with the parking lot lighting that was installed earlier this year. This is being addressed to re-angle the lights to make them more effective. In addition, all the trees on the woods-side of the parking lot have been trimmed back out of the way. In fact, all the trees on the property have been trimmed to remove dead limbs in danger of falling.

**FUNDRAISER RESULTS** Thank you to all who showed their support by ordering SKT-LMC spirit-wear. We were able to raise almost \$1,000 to benefit our community. #### THE SECOND READING Heb 12:5-7, 11-13

Brothers and sisters, You have forgotten the exhortation addressed to you as children: "My son, do not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reproved by him; for whom the Lord loves, he disciplines; he scourges every son he acknowledges. "Endure your trials as "discipline"; God treats you as sons. For what "son" is there whom his father does not discipline? At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain,

yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it. So strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees. Make straight paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed.

#### **GOSPEL** Lk 13:22-30

Jesus passed through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" He answered them, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough. After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, 'Lord, open the door for us.' He will say to you in reply, 'I do not know where you are from. And you will say, 'We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets.' Then he will say to you, 'I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!' And there will be wailing and grinding of teeth when you see Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God and you yourselves cast out. And people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God. For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."

God is in his holy dwelling, God who makes men of one mind to dwell in a house; he shall give power and strength to his people. God arises; his enemies are scattered, and those who hate him flee before him. Glory be to the Father. God is in his holy dwelling.

**PRAYER** Almighty and eternal God, your bounteous kindness exceeds the merits and fondest hopes of our prayers. Shower your mercy upon us, forgive us the sins that strike fear in our consciences, and grant us the blessings we dare not presume to ask for. Through Jesus Christ.

#### **EPISTLE** 1 Cor. 15, 1-10

Brethren: I want to remind you of the gospel that I preached to you, which you welcomed and in which you are standing firm. By it you are even now being saved, if you are holding on to it just as I preached it to you unless you have believed in vain. I handed on to you first of all what I myself received, namely, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried and, in accordance with the Scriptures, rose on the third day; that he was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve. After that he was seen by more than five hundred brethren at the same time, most of whom are still alive, although some have fallen asleep. Then he was seen by James, then by all the apostles. And last of all he showed himself to me, to one strangely born into the apostolic family. Indeed, I am the least of all the apostles. I do not deserve the name "apostle," because I persecuted the Church of God. But by God's favor I am what I am, and his favor to me has not proved fruitless.

#### **GOSPEL** Mark 7, 31-37

At that time, Jesus left Tyrian territory and returned via Sidon to the sea of Galilee, into the district of the Ten Cities. And some people brought him a deaf man with a speech impediment, and begged him to lay his hand upon him. So he took him off by himself, away from the crowd. He put his fingers into his ears and spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven, and groaned, saying to him, "Ephphatha!" (that is, "Be opened"). At once his ears were opened, and the knot in his tongue was untied, and he began to speak plainly. Then he strictly enjoined them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, all the more they proclaimed it; and their amazement knew no bounds: "All he has accomplished is wonderful! He even gives hearing to the deaf, speech to the mute."

**OFFERTORY** I will extol you, O Lord, for you drew me clear and did not let my enemies rejoice over me; O Lord, I cried out to you and you healed me.

**SECRET** O Lord, look mercifully upon this service of ours so that our gift may be acceptable to you and worthy of winning your assistance for our weakness. Through Jesus Christ your Son, Our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. Amen.

**COMMUNION** Honor the Lord with your wealth, with first fruits of all your produce. Then will your barns be filled with grain, with new wine your vats will overflow.

**POST COMMUNION** O Lord, may we experience strength of mind and body from the sacrament we have received. Let it restore health to both that we may glory in your heavenly healing. Through Jesus Christ.





The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!


