

### **GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION**

**CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER** the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are spiritually prepared (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a worthy Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary before the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

**CATHOLIC COUPLES** in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

#### THE FIRST READING Wis 9:13-18

Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the LORD intends? For the deliberations of mortals are timid, and unsure are our plans. For the corruptible body burdens the soul and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns. And scarce do we guess the things on earth, and what is within our grasp we find with difficulty; but when things are in heaven, who can search them out? Or who ever knew your counsel, except you had given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high? And thus were the paths of those on earth made straight.

### THE SECOND READING Philemon 9-10, 12-17

I, Paul, an old man, and now also a prisoner for Christ Jesus, urge you on behalf of my child Onesimus, whose father I have become in my imprisonment; I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I should have liked to retain him for myself, so that he might serve me on your behalf in my imprisonment for the gospel, but I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that the good you do might not be forced but voluntary. Perhaps this is why he was away from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a brother, beloved especially to me, but even more so to you, as a man and in the Lord. So if you regard me as a partner, welcome him as you would me.

#### GOSPEL Lk 14:25-33

Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

### ENTRANCE ANTIPHON Ps. 73, 20, 19 and 23

Look to your covenant, O Lord, forsake not forever the lives of your afflicted ones. Arise, O Lord; defend your cause; be not unmindful of the voices of those who ask you. Why, O God, have you cast us off forever? Why does your anger smolder against the sheep of your pasture? Glory be to the Father. Look.

**PRAYER** Almighty and eternal God, deepen our faith, our hope and our charity. Make us love what you have commanded so that we may attain what you have promised. Through Jesus Christ.

### EPISTLE Gal. 3, 16-22

Brethren: The promises were spoken to Abraham "and to his offspring." It is not said: "and to his offsprings," as applicable to many, but in a way applicable to one only: "and to your offspring," that is, Christ. I make a further point: a covenant formally ratified by God is not set aside as no longer valid by the Law that came into being four hundred and thirty years later, so as to render the Promise null and void. Clearly if one's inheritance comes by virtue of the Law it is no longer conferred by virtue of the promise. Yet it was by way of the Promise that God granted Abraham his privilege. What, then, is the relevance of the Law? It was given as a supplement, in view of transgressions of it; it was promulgated by the help of angels and with the services of a mediator; but it was intended to be valid only until that Offspring came to whom the Promise had been given. Now there can be no mediator when only one person acts and God is only one. Then is the Law in opposition to God's promises? Impossible! Obviously, if the Law which was given were such as could itself give life, justice would in reality be a consequence of the Law. But in fact Scripture has locked in all things under the restraining force of sin, so that the promise might be given to those who believe, as a fruit of faith in Jesus Christ.

### GOSPEL Luke 17, 11-19

At that time on his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus passed along the border of Samaria and Galilee. As he entered a village ten lepers went to meet him. Keeping their distance they raised their voices and said: "Jesus, Master, have pity on us." When he saw them he said, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And on their way they were made clean. One of them, realizing that he had been made clean, returned praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself face down at the feet of Jesus, thanking him. And this man was a Samaritan. Jesus' comment was: "Were not ten of Credo. them made clean? Where are the other nine? Was no one found to return and give glory to God except this stranger?" And he said to the man, "Stand up, and go your way; your faith has saved you."

**OFFERTORY** My trust is in you, O Lord; I say, "You are my God." In your hands is my destiny.

**SECRET** O Lord, look with favor upon your people and their gifts. Let this offering move you to compassion, and grant us forgiveness for our sins and a speedy answer to our prayers. Through Jesus Christ.

**COMMUNION** You have given us, O Lord, bread from heaven, endowed with all delights and the sweetness of every taste.

**POST COMMUNION** O Lord, may the reception of your heavenly sacrament bring us ever nearer to our eternal redemption. Through Jesus Christ.

# CHURCH ETIQUETTE

**WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH** please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

**DRESS CODE** Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

**THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS** to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

**IN ADDITION** ...We should make a determined effort to be on time for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
