GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a worthy Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary before the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

CATHOLIC COUPLES in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

But Moses implored the LORD, his God, saying, "Why, O LORD, should your wrath blaze up against your own people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with such great power and with so strong a hand? GOSPEL Lk 15:1-10

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them he addressed this parable. "What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance. "Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.' In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all gaes. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (here all bow) AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. ENTRANCE ANTIPHON Ps. 83, 10-11

Behold, O God, our protector, and look upon the face of your anointed. Better is one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere. How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts! My soul yearns and pines for the courts of the Lord. Glory be to the Father. Behold.

PRAYER Keep your Church, O Lord, in your everlasting mercy. Without your assistance our human nature is bound to fall, so help us to shun whatever is harmful and guide us toward those things that will aid our salvation. Through Jesus Christ.

EPISTLE Gal. 5, 16-24

Brethren: Act according to the spirit; then you will not carry out the desires of the flesh. The desires of the flesh are against the spirit, and those of the spirit are against the flesh; these two are directly opposed to one another. That is why you do not carry out what your will intends. But if you are led by the spirit, you are not under the Law. Now it is obvious what proceeds from the flesh: fornication, impurity, indecency, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, contentiousness, jealousy, outbursts of rage, rivalries, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, orgies of debauchery, and the like. I warn you, as I have warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God! But the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patient endurance, kindness, goodness, faith, mildness, self-control. Against such there is no law! Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified their flesh with its passions and desires.

GOSPEL Matthew 6, 24-33

At that time Jesus said to his disciples: "No man can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be attentive to one and despise the other. You cannot devote yourself to God and to money. So I warn you, do not worry about your livelihood, about what you are to eat, or what you are to drink, or how you are to clothe yourselves. Is not life more important than food? Is not the body more important than clothes? Take a look at the birds in the sky: they do not sow; they do not reap; they gather nothing into barns. Yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Aren't you more important than they? Still, which of you by worrying can add a single moment to his allotted span of life? And as for clothes, what are you worrying about? Learn a lesson from the way the wild lilies grow. They do not toil; they do not spin thread. Yet I assure you, not even Solomon in his royal robes was arrayed like one of them. If God can so deck out the wild flowers which bloom today but tomorrow are thrown into the oven, is he not much more likely to provide for you? What weak faith you have! Stop

worrying then over questions like 'What are we to eat?', 'What are we to drink?', 'What are we to wear?'. That is what pagans are always looking for. Your heavenly Father realizes that you need all this sort of thing. Seek first his kingdom and his will, and everything else will be given to you."

OFFERTORY The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and delivers them. Taste and see how good the Lord is.

SECRET O Lord, grant that this life-giving sacrifice may take away our sins and appease your majesty. Through Jesus Christ.

COMMUNION "Seek first the kingdom of God; and all things shall be given you besides," says the Lord.

POST COMMUNION May your sacrament ever cleanse and strengthen us, O God, and lead us to eternal salvation. Through Jesus Christ.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be on time for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
