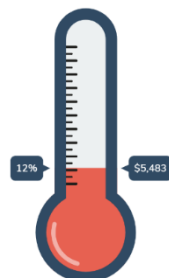

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

CATHOLIC COUPLES in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

FALL CLEANUP WORKDAY It is that time of year once again when we are asking for your help for our fall cleanup. CMA-2022/2023 By now you have received your package from the Diocese regarding the CMA campaign for 2022/2023. Our goal this year has been raised to \$47,000. This is quite an increase from last year's campaign. We were fortunate after our appeal that the Diocese forgave our shortfall from last year. To meet this year's goal, we will need everyone's support. We are aware that the economy is affecting all of us. We only ask that you do your best whatever it maybe in contributing to the campaign. Your full contribution will not be due until May of 2023. As in the past, any shortfall will be made up by the parish. As mentioned in the past, those that are required to take their minimum distribution from their IRA's, can designate your contribution to the CMA. There is a tax advantage to make your contribution from your IRA. This will result in your contribution to the CMA to be a non-taxable distribution. At the same time, you will not be able to deduct your contribution as a charitable contribution. Please make sure that you indicate our parish number 400, when you complete your paperwork, for this transaction with your financial advisor. You may also use your IRA required distribution to make any other year-end donations to LMC.

We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE FIRST READING 2 Mc 7:1-2, 9-14

It happened that seven brothers with their mother were arrested and tortured with whips and scourges by the king, to force them to eat pork in violation of God's law. One of the brothers, speaking for the others, said: "What do you expect to achieve by questioning us? We are ready to die rather than transgress the laws of our ancestors." At the point of death he said: "You accursed fiend, you are depriving us of this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up to live again forever. It is for his laws that we are dying." After him the third suffered their cruel sport. He put out his tongue at once when told to do so, and bravely held out his hands, as he spoke these noble words: "It was from Heaven that I received these; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again." Even the king and his attendants marveled at the young man's courage, because he regarded his sufferings as nothing. After he had died, they tortured and maltreated the fourth brother in the same way. When he was near death, he said, "It is my choice to die at the hands of men with the hope God gives of being raised up by him; but for you, there will be no resurrection to life."

THE SECOND READING 2 Thes 2:16-3:5

Brothers and sisters: May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement and good hope through his grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good

deed and word. Finally, brothers and sisters, pray for us, so that the word of the Lord may speed forward and be glorified, as it did among you, and that we may be delivered from perverse and wicked people, for not all have faith. But the Lord is faithful; he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one. We are confident of you in the Lord that what we instruct you, you are doing and will continue to do. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ.

GOSPEL Lk 20:27, 34-38

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward. Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *(here all bow)* **AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN.** For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Brethren: I am sure of precisely this in the Lord Jesus, that he who has begun in you a noble work will by the same token, carry it through to completion right up to the day of Christ Jesus. It is only natural that I should entertain such expectations in regard to all of you, since I hold all of you in my heart - you who are one and all sharers with me in this favor of imprisonment and of defense of the gospel and its firm establishment. God himself can testify how much I long for each of you with the affection of Christ Jesus! This is what I pray for: that your love may abound ever more and more in knowledge and depth of experience, so that you may learn to value those things that are really important, in purity of conscience and in blameless conduct right up to the day of Christ. GOSPEL Matth. 22, 15-21

At that time the Pharisees went off and began to plot how they might trap Jesus in speech. So they sent their disciples to him, accompanied by the Herodians, to say, "Master, we know you are a sincere man, and sincerely teach God's way of life. You are unconcerned about anybody's opinion, since you don't act out of human respect. Then tell us your opinion about this case. Is it lawful to pay the poll-tax to the Emperor, or not?" But Jesus, realizing their bad faith, said to them, "Why are you trying to trip me up, you hypocrites? Show me the coin used for the poll-tax." When they handed him a Roman coin, he asked them, "Whose head is this, and whose inscription?" "The Emperor's," they replied. At that he said to them, "Then give to the Emperor what is the Emperor's, but to God what is God's."

OFFERTORY Remember me, O Lord, you who rule above all power: and give a well-ordered speech in my mouth, that my words may be pleasing in the sight of the prince.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
