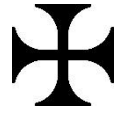

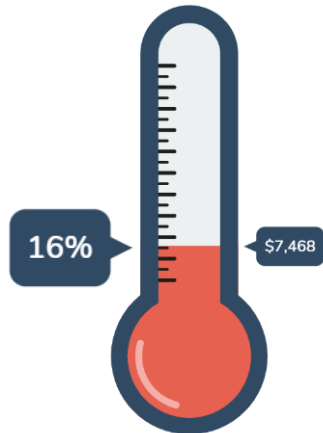

## GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

**CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER** the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

**CATHOLIC COUPLES** in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

# WEEKLY NOTICES

**THANKSGIVING DAY** is coming up on Thursday, November 24. Both English and Latin Masses will be celebrated with music. Every year we alternate the order in which they are offered: this year the first will be the English Mass at 8:30am, and the second will be the Latin Mass at 10:30am..

**FALL CLEANUP WORKDAY** It is that time of year once again when we are asking for your help for our fall cleanup. We are hoping that a majority of the leaves will be down and we get our campus cleaned up before we get our first snowfall. A majority of the cleanup will be raking up leaves around and under the bushes, along the buildings, fences and the parking lot area backing up to the woods. A workday is planned for Saturday November 19 from 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM. We will provide bags for the leaves. We ask that you bring your own rakes, gloves, leaf blowers and tarps and brooms. We have found that in the past the large tarps have made it easier to clean up the leaves. Please consider spending some time with us on the 19th. Families are welcome. It is a fun day. **CMA-2022/2023** By now you have received your package from the Diocese regarding the CMA campaign for 2022/2023. Our goal this year has been raised to \$47,000. This is quite an increase from last year's campaign. We were fortunate after our appeal that the Diocese forgave our shortfall from last year. To meet this year's goal, we will need everyone's support. We are aware that the economy is affecting all of us. We only ask that you do your best whatever it maybe in contributing to the campaign. Your full contribution will not be due until May of 2023. As in the past, any shortfall will be made up by the parish. As mentioned in the past, those that are required to take their minimum distribution from their IRA's, can designate your contribution to the CMA. There is a tax advantage to make your contribution from your IRA. This will result in your contribution to the CMA to be a non-taxable distribution. At the same time, you will not be able to deduct your contribution as a charitable contribution. Please make sure that you indicate our parish number 400, when you complete your paperwork, for this transaction with your financial advisor. You may also use your IRA required distribution to make any other year-end donations to LMC.

## THE SECOND READING 2 Thes 3:7-12

Brothers and sisters: You know how one must imitate us. For we did not act in a disorderly way among you, nor did we eat food received free from anyone. On the contrary, in toil and drudgery, night and day we worked, so as not to burden any of you. Not that we do not have the right. Rather, we wanted to present ourselves as a model for you, so that you might imitate us. In fact, when we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat. We hear that some are conducting themselves among you in a disorderly way, by not keeping busy but minding the business of others. Such people we instruct and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to work quietly and to eat their own food.

## GOSPEL Lk 21:5-19

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here--the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And

what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

**CREDO** I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *(here all bow)* **AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN.** For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## **EPISTLE** Philipp. 3, 17-21; 4, 1-3

Brethren: Join the others who follow my example and observe the behavior of those who conduct themselves according to the pattern you have in us. For alas, many go about in a manner which shows them to be enemies of the cross of Christ, as I have often said to you and now say again tearfully. These people will end up in disaster! Their only god is their stomach; their "glory" is their very shamefulness. I mean those people whose sole concern is things of this world. For, as you know, we are citizens of heaven. And it is from there that we hopefully await expectantly the coming of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will give a new form to this lowly body of ours, making it into an image of his own glorified body. This he will do by the power he has to bring all things into submission to his will. For these reasons, my brothers whom I so love and long for, you who are my joy and my crown, stand firm in the Lord, worthy of love. I plead with Evodia and Synteché: come to a mutual understanding in the Lord. Yes, and I ask you also, my true fellow-worker, go to their aid, for they have struggled at my side in promoting the gospel, along with Clement and my other co-workers, all of whose names are in the Book of Life.

**GRADUAL** You saved us, O Lord, from our foes, and those who hated us you put to shame. In God we gloried day by day; your name we praised always. Alleluia, alleluia. Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord; Lord, hear my prayer! Alleluia.

## **GOSPEL** Matth. 9, 18-26

At that time Jesus had not finished speaking to the crowds when, suddenly, a magistrate came along, did him reverence, and said, "My daughter has just died. But please come and lay your hand on her and she will come back to life." Jesus stood up and followed him, and his disciples did likewise. Now a woman who had suffered from hemorrhages for twelve years came along behind him, and touched the tassel on his cloak. "If only I can touch his cloak," she thought to herself, "I shall get well." Jesus turned around, saw her, and said, "Courage, my daughter! Your



faith has made you well." That very moment the woman got well. When Jesus arrived at the magistrate's house and saw the flute-players and the crowd making a dreadful din, he said, "Get out of here. The little girl is not dead. She is asleep." At this, they laughed at him. But when the crowd had been put out, he entered, took her by the hand, and the little girl got up. News of this circulated around that entire district.

## CHURCH ETIQUETTE

**WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH** please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

**DRESS CODE** Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

**THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS** to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

**IN ADDITION** ...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
