

THE SECOND READING 1 Cor 2:6-10

Rather, we speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, Which God predetermined before the ages for our glory, and which none of the rulers of this age knew; for, if they had known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But as it is written: What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him, this God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit scrutinizes everything, even the depths of God.

GOSPEL MT 5:20-22, 27-28, 33-34, 37

Jesus said to his disciples: "I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. "You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment. "You have heard that it was said, You shall not commit adultery. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. "Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow. But I say to you, do not swear at all. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes, 'and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one."

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (here all bow) AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

INTROIT Awake! Why are you asleep, O Lord? Arise! Cast us not off forever! Why do you hide your face, forgetting our oppression? Our bodies are pressed to the earth. Arise, O Lord, help us, and deliver us. O God, our ears have heard, our fathers have declared to us. Glory be to the Father. Awake!

COLLECT O God, you see that we place no trust in our own actions. May the prayers of the Doctor of the Gentiles defend us against all advers!ty. Through Jesus Christ.

EPISTLE 2 Cor. 11, 19-33; 12, 1-9

Brethren: You gladly put up with fools, being wise yourselves. Why you even put up with those who try to enslave you, with those who exploit you, with those who impose upon you, with those who put on airs, with those who slap you in the face. To my shame I must confess that we have been too weak to do such things. But what anyone else dares to claim I am talking foolishly now I, too, will dare. Are they Hebrews? So am I ! Are they Israelites? So am I! Are they offspring of Abraham? So am I ! Are they ministers of Christ? Now I am really talking like a fool - I am more! with many more labors, with many more imprisonments, with far worse beatings, frequently in danaer of death. Five times at the hands of the Jews I received forty lashes less one; three times I was beaten with rods; once I was stoned; three times I was shipwrecked; I passed a day and a night in the sea. I was continually on journeys with danger from floods, with danger from robbers; in danger from my own people and from the Gentiles; with danger in the city, in the desert and on the sea; in danger from false brothers; with labor and hardship, with many sleepless nights; in hunger and thirst and frequent fastings, in cold and nakedness; and, leaving other sufferings unmentioned, there is that daily tension pressing down on me, my anxiety for all the churches. Who is weak, and I am not affected by it? Who is scandalized, and I am not inflamed with indignation? If I must boast, I will boast about my weaknesses. The God and Father of the Lord Jesus knows-may he be blessed forever I-that I am not lying. In Damascus the ethnarch of King Aretas was keeping a close watch on the city in order to arrest me, but I was lowered in a basket through a window in the wall and I escaped his hands. I must go on boasting, useless though it is. I shall speak of visions and revelations of the Lord. I know a man in Christ, who, fourteen years ago-whether he was in his body, or outside his body, I don't know, but God does-was snatched up even to the third heaven; and I know that this man - whether he was in his body or outside it, I don't know, God knows-was snatched up even into Paradise and heard words which can't be uttered, which no man is permitted to speak. About this man I will boast, but I will not boast about myself, unless it be about my weaknesses. If I should boast, I would not really be foolish, because I wouldbe telling the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think more of me than what he sees in me or hears from me. Now with respect to the extraordinary revelations, in order that I might not become conceited I was given a thorn for the flesh, an angel of Satan to beat me, to keep me from becoming proud. Three times I begaed the Lord about this, that it might leave me. And he said to me: "My favor is enough for you, for in weakness power reaches perfection." Gladly, therefore, will I boast rather about my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

GRADUAL Let the nations know that God is your name; you alone are the Most High over all the earth. O my God, make them like leaves in a whirlwind, like chaff before the wind.

GOSPEL Luke 8, 4-15

At that time a large crowd was gathering, and men were resorting to him city by city. He spoke to them in a parable: "A farmer went out to sow seed. And in the sowing, some seed fell on the footpath where it was walked on and the birds of the air ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, sprouted up, and withered through lack of moisture. Some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up with it, and stifled it. And some fell on good soil, grew up, and yielded grain a hundred for one." As he said this he exclaimed: "Let everyone heed what he has heard." His disciples began asking him what was the meaning of this parable, and he said: "To you have been confided the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but the rest have only parables that 'seeing they may not perceive and hearing may not understand.' This is the meaning of the parable. 'The seed' is the word of God. 'Those on the footpath' are those who hear, but the devil comes and takes the word out of their hearts lest they should believe and be saved. 'Those on the rocky ground' are they who, when they hear it, receive the word with joy. These have no root; they believe for awhile, but they fall away in time of temptation. 'The seed fallen among thorns' are those who hear but their progress is stifled by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and they do not mature. 'The seed m good ground' are they who hear the word with nobility and goodness of heart, and retain it, and bear fruit in perseverance."

OFFERTORY Make my steps steadfast in your paths, that my feet may not falter. Incline your ear to me; hear my word. Show your wondrous kindness, O Lord, savior of those who trust in you.

SECRET May the sacrifice we offer you, O Lord, always bring us new life and keep us safe. Through Jesus Christ.

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

CATHOLICS NEED TO REMEMBER the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary before the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle.

CATHOLIC COUPLES in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be on time for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
