CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. *It is possible for emails and texts to wait until later!*

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ... We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.

CMA 2023-2024 The Diocese of Rochester has launched its 2023-2024 Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA). The goal of the CMA this year is \$6.725 million, funding more than half of the diocesan budget. There are seven categories of the CMA allocation. For details about this year's allocation, you can go to www.dor.org/cma. Our goal this year is \$47,000 which is the same as last year's. We will need everyone's support to meet this goal. For those who are required to take their required minimum distributions from their IRA's, you can make your contribution to the CMA from your IRA. This results in a tax benefit to you. Your financial advisor should be able to assist you with this benefit.

Please remember to note our **parish number 400** on the paperwork so that the Diocese gives us the proper credit for your donation. Finally, it should be noted that all monies raised in the CMA are only used for the programs, services, and ministries for which they are designated. No gifts to the CMA are used to satisfy settlement costs associated with abuse cases nor legal fees surrounding this matter.

SUPPORT OUR COMMUNITY Sometimes it might feel like we can't give as much as we'd like to in support of our Community. Financial times are difficult, but perhaps you can spare some time. THE SPIRITUAL WORK OF MERCY; GAIN A PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR THE DEAD A plenary indulgence is granted each and every day from November 1st to the 8th by devoutly visiting a cemetery to pray for the departed. You can also do this any day of the year, but the indulgence is *partial*. **Requirements for obtaining a plenary indulgence:**

- Do the work while in a state of grace & receive Sacramental Confession within 20 days (several indulgences may be earned per reception) & recite specific prayers whilst visiting the cemetery
- · Receive Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist (one plenary indulgence may be earned per reception)
- Pray for the Pope's intentions (Our Father and Hail Mary, or other appropriate prayer, is sufficient)
- Have no attachment to sin (even venial) it is sufficient that the Christian makes an act of the will to love God and despise sin; an Act of Contrition.

Partial indulgences can be earned if confession cannot be heard or you cannot receive Holy Communion, as long as you are in the state of grace. Only one plenary indulgence is granted per day/visit during the Octave. You are invited to do this on your own time during the Octave, but if enough people are interested, we would like to go as a community and meet at a set time each day. GOSPEL Mt 21:33-43

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, "Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast." Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city.

Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests."


THE SAINT MICHAEL PRAYER (Pope Leo XIII)

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are spiritually prepared (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a worthy Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary before the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and full of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle. Catholic couples in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.
