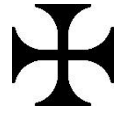

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 1 ALL SAINTS HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION. Latin Mass will be celebrated here at 12 NOON; English Mass at 5:30pm. Conscientious Catholics do not lightly excuse themselves from attending Mass on Holy days of Obligation. Please come to worship not only because of obligation, but more so because of opportunity – in this case the opportunity to honor all of Gods glorious saints and to ask them to come to our assistance as **we** walk with Him and with them on the journey of life.

THURSDAY, MAY 30, 2024 CMA pledges are due. To date (14) donors have pledged \$4,348 bringing us to 9.25% of our goal.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. *It is possible for emails and texts to wait until later!*

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ... We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.

CMA 2023-2024 The Diocese of Rochester has launched its 2023-2024 Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA). The goal of the CMA this year is \$6.725 million, funding more than half of the diocesan budget. There are seven categories of the CMA allocation. For details about this year's allocation, you can go to www.dor.org/cma. Our goal this year is **\$47,000** *which is the same as last year's*. We will need everyone's support to meet this goal. For those who are required to take their required minimum distributions from their IRA's, you can make your contribution to the CMA from your IRA. This results in a tax benefit to you. Your financial advisor should be able to assist you with this benefit. Please remember to note our **parish number 400** on the paperwork so that the Diocese gives us the proper credit for your donation. Finally, it should be noted that all monies raised in the CMA are only used for the programs, services, and ministries for which they are designated. No gifts to the CMA are used to satisfy settlement costs associated with abuse cases nor legal fees surrounding this matter.

SUPPORT OUR COMMUNITY Sometimes it might feel like we can't give as much as we'd like to in support of our Community. Financial times are difficult, but perhaps you can spare some time. We need participation in key volunteer positions in order to continue to serve the community with liturgy, sacraments, education, and social activities. If you are not yet volunteering in some capacity, please consider filling one of the current needs that have been discussed in our bulletins lately or drop an inquiry into one of the collection boxes. Your time and talent will make a big difference for everyone.

THE SPIRITUAL WORK OF MERCY; GAIN A PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR THE DEAD A plenary indulgence is granted each and every day from November 1st to the 8th, but how can it be done with busy work and school schedules? Plan a visit to confession first - beginning today, a confession heard would count towards gaining the indulgence. As All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation, a visit to the cemetery before or after Mass might be best for your schedule. Otherwise, a visit before or after Mass on a Sunday may be the 2nd best fit. Otherwise, if your schedule is flexible, try to attend daily Mass on the same day you plan to visit the cemetery. Regardless of when you go, once there, recite the Our Father, Hail Mary & pray for the Pope's intentions. Like Mardi Gras, Easter & Christmas, the world has done its best to secularize a Catholic holiday; Halloween itself is the beginning of an ancient Catholic triduum! On All Hallows (October 31st), the "Church Militant" (those of us on earth) begin by reflecting on the realities of death (memento mori). November 1st, we reflect on the Church Triumphant (the Saints in heaven). Lastly, on November 2nd, we focus on the Church Suffering (those holy souls in purgatory) and continue to pray for them for the remainder of the month. ALL SOULS' DAY MASS AND ADORATION On Thursday, November 2, Holy Sepulchre Cemetery is pleased to host a day of Eucharistic Adoration as part of the 3-year Eucharistic Revival, which aims to "renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist." The Faithful are invited to pray quietly in the presence of our Eucharistic Lord **in the historic All Souls Chapel** from 11am – 5pm. Following these hours of Adoration, a Mass for The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, will be offered by The Most Reverend Salvatore R. Matano, Bishop of Rochester, for the souls of those buried at Holy Sepulchre and Ascension Garden Cemeteries at 5:30pm **in the Chapel of Christ Our Light Mausoleum.**

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE FIRST READING Ex 22:20-26

Thus says the LORD: "You shall not molest or oppress an alien, for you were once aliens yourselves in the land of Egypt. You shall not wrong any widow or orphan. If ever you wrong them and they cry out to me, I will surely hear their cry. My wrath will flare up, and I will kill you with the sword; then your own wives will be widows, and your children orphans. "If you lend money to one of your poor neighbors among my people, you shall not act like an extortioner toward him by demanding interest from him. If you take your neighbor's cloak as a pledge, you shall return it to him before sunset; for this cloak of his is the only covering he has for his body. What else has he to sleep in? If he cries out to me, I will hear him; for I am compassionate."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

I love you, Lord, my strength.

THE SECOND READING 1 Thes 1:5c-10

Brothers and sisters: You know what sort of people we were among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, receiving the word in great affliction,

with joy from the Holy Spirit, so that you became a model for all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For from you the word of the Lord has sounded forth not only in Macedonia and in Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has gone forth, so that we have no need to say anything. For they themselves openly declare about us what sort of reception we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God and to await his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus, who delivers us from the coming wrath.

GOSPEL Mt 21:33-43

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law tested him by asking, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (*here all bow*) **AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN.** For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

EXTRAORDINARY FORM - LATIN

INTROIT Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive power, and divinity, and wisdom, and strength, and honor. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. O God, with your judgment endow the king, and with your justice, the king's son. Glory be to the Father. Worthy is the Lamb.

COLLECT Almighty and eternal God, you have renewed all creation in your beloved Son, the king of the whole universe. May all the peoples of the earth, now torn apart by the wound of sin, become subject to the gentle rule of your only-begotten Son: Who lives and reigns.

EPISTLE Colossians I, 12-20

Brethren: Give thanks to the Father for making you worthy to share the lot of the saints in light. For he rescued us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, through whom we have redemption, and the forgiveness of our sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creatures; for in him everything was created in heaven and on earth, things visible and invisible, whether Thrones, or Dominations, or Principalities, or Powers; they were all created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is head of the body, the Church; he is the beginning, the firstborn of the dead, that he may hold first place in everything. At that time Pilate said to Jesus: "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Are you saying this on your own, or have others been telling you about me?" "I'm no Jew, am I?" Pilate retorted. "It is your own nation and the chief priests who handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom belonged to this world, my subjects would be fighting to save me from being handed over to the Jews. But, as it is, my kingdom does not belong here." At this, Pilate said to him. "So then, you are a king?" Jesus replied, "You say that I am a king. The reason why I have been born, the reason I have come into the world, is to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

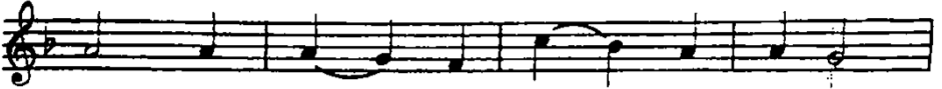
GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. **Practicing Catholics** who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle. **Catholic couples** in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

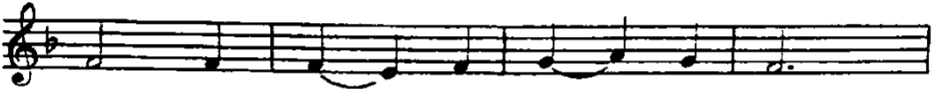

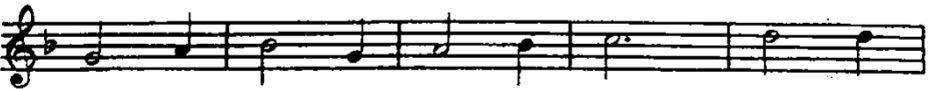

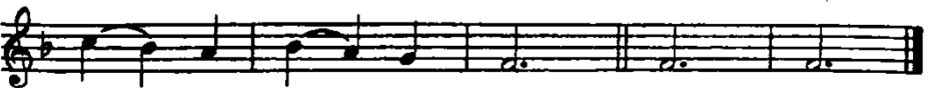
