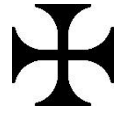

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. *It is possible for emails and texts to wait until later!*

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! **REVERENCE** for God and **RESPECT** for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) **RESPECT** for the House of God, (2) **REVERENCE** for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) **REGARD** for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be **DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION**. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ... We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the **CONSECRATION** of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.

CASH PRIZES for the Knights of Columbus "Keep Christ in Christmas" poster Contest have been announced: \$25 for the best poster in each age category (5-7, 8-10, 11-14) and \$10 for the runner-up in each age category. CMA THROUGH 11/5 (18) DONORS HAVE PLEDGED \$5,358 OR 11.4% OF OUR GOAL. The Diocese of Rochester has launched its 2023-2024 Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA). The goal of the CMA this year is \$6.725 million, funding more than half of the diocesan budget. There are seven categories of the CMA allocation. For details about this year's allocation, you can go to www.dor.org/cma. Our goal this year is **\$47,000** *which is the same as last year's*. We will need everyone's support to meet this goal. For those who are required to take their required minimum distributions from their IRA's, you can make your contribution to the CMA from your IRA. This results in a tax benefit to you. Your financial advisor should be able to assist you with this benefit. Please remember to note our **parish number 400** on the paperwork so that the Diocese gives us the proper credit for your donation. Finally, it should be noted that all monies raised in the CMA are only used for the programs, services, and ministries for which they are designated. No gifts to the CMA are used to satisfy settlement costs associated with abuse cases nor legal fees surrounding this matter.

SUPPORT OUR COMMUNITY Sometimes it might feel like we can't give as much as we'd like to in support of our Community. Financial times are difficult, but perhaps you can spare some time. We need participation in key volunteer positions in order to continue to serve the community with liturgy, sacraments, education, and social activities. THE SECOND READING 1 Thes 5:1-6

Concerning times and seasons, brothers and sisters, you have no need for anything to be written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night. When people are saying, "Peace and security, " then sudden disaster comes upon them, like labor pains upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness, for that day to overtake you like a thief. For all of you are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober.

GOSPEL Mt 25:14-15, 19-21

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one-to each according to his ability. Then he went away. "After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them. The one who had received five talents came forward bringing the additional five. He said, 'Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and

faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy."

I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

LETTER REGARDING SCHOOL

Dear Saint Kateri Tekakwitha Parishioners,

The next Irondequoit Zoning board meeting and vote is scheduled for Monday, December 4th.

In the past ten years, all previous efforts to sell the old school building have been unsuccessful. The school building has now reached a state of such significant deterioration, that it presents an inordinate risk and liability that cannot be remedied with limited parish funds. Also, the continuing obligation of carrying costs on an empty building, such as required insurance, continues to climb.

Both of us have discussed these concerns with each other and with many others.

In the absence of any other feasible, realistic, and acceptable proposal, the current zoning variance proposal may well be the best path forward.

We love our church family and want a workable solution to this dilemma.

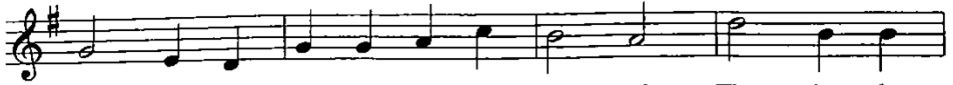
THE SAINT MICHAEL PRAYER (Pope Leo XIII)

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. **Practicing Catholics** who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle. **Catholic couples** in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

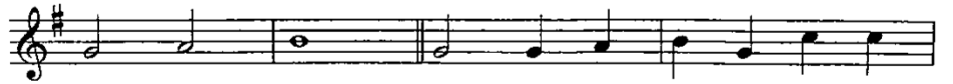
