

# CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. *It is possible for emails and texts to wait until later!* 

**DRESS CODE** Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

**THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS** to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

**IN ADDITION...** We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.

# **GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION**

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. <u>Practicing</u> <u>Catholics</u> who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle. <u>Catholic</u> <u>couples</u> in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

#### THE FIRST READING Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being." Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

#### THE SECOND READING 1 Jn 4:7-10

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love. In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him. In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins.

#### GOSPEL Jn 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

**CREDO** I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN*. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death

and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Beloved: Act on this revelation. If you only listen to it, you are fooling yourselves. For a man who listens to divine revelation but does not put it into practice is like a man who looks in a mirror at the face he was born with. He looks at himself, then off he goes and promptly forgets how he appeared. But then there is the man who peers into the ideal law that is characterized by freedom, and he does so continually. He is no forgetful listener but he does things in practice. Happy will this man be in his accomplishment. Then there is the case of a man whose tongue is not controlled. He imagines that he is devout, but this is self-deception. That man's worship is pointless. Looking after orphans and widows in their distress, keeping oneself unspotted by the world, this is pure and stainless worship before our God and Father.

**ALLELUIA** Alleluia, alleluia. Christ is risen, and has shone upon us, whom he redeemed with his blood. Alleluia. I came forth from the Father, and have come into the world. Again I leave the world, and go the Father. Alleluia.

#### GOSPEL John 16, 23-30

At that time Jesus said to his disciples: "Truly I assure you, whatever you ask the Father, He will give you in my name. Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you shall receive that your joy may be complete. I have said all this to you in figures of speech. An hour is coming when I shall no longer speak to you in figures, but tell you plainly about the Father. On that day you will ask in my name; and this does not mean that I shall have to petition the Father for you. For the Father himself loves you, since you have loved me and have believed that I came forth from God. I came forth from the Father and I have come into the world. Now I am leaving the world and I am going to the Father." "Why, at last," his disciples exclaimed, "you are talking plainly without any figure of speech! Now we know that you know everything-no need for anybody to ask you questions. Because of this we believe that you came forth from God."

**OFFERTORY** Bless the Lord our God, you peoples, loudly sound his praise; he has given life to my soul, and has not let my feet slip. Blessed be the Lord, who refused me not my prayer, or his kindness, alleluia.

**SECRET** Accept the prayers and sacrificial offering of the faithful, O Lord, and let our love and devotion lead us to the glory of heaven. Through Jesus Christ.

**COMMUNION** Sing to the Lord, alleluia; sing to the Lord; bless his name; announce his salvation day after day, alleluia, alleluia.

**POST COMMUNION** Grant that we, who have been fed and strengthened at your heavenly banquet, O Lord, may desire only what is right and that we may fulfill these holy des!res. Through Jesus Christ.
