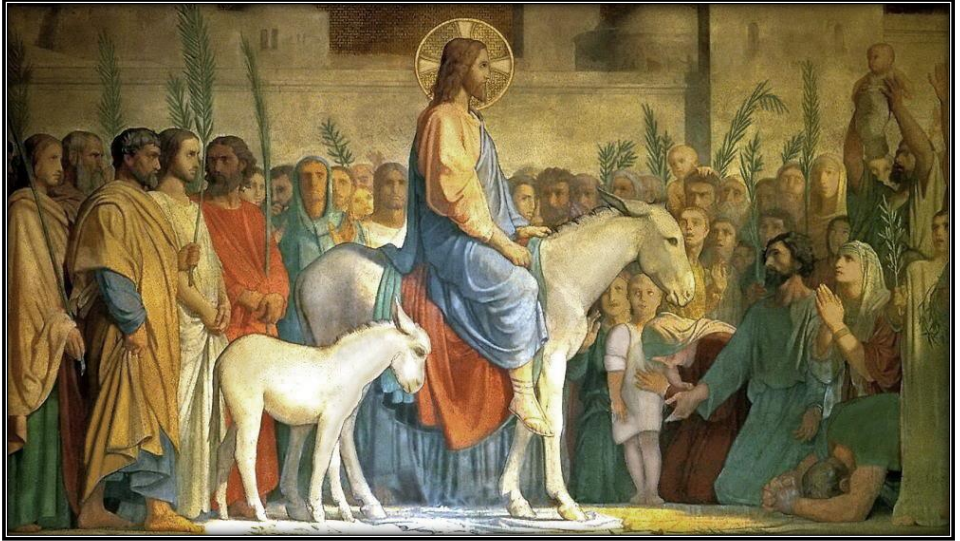
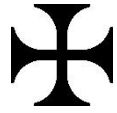

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are spiritually prepared (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a worthy Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary before the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and full of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle. Catholic couples in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

THE ADORATION CHAPEL will not be open for visitation this week on Holy Thursday and Good Friday.

THE SECOND & THIRD PRECEPTS (COMMANDMENTS/LAWS) of the CHURCH: All Catholics who have reached the age of reason must confess their (mortal) sins in the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year. They must also receive Holy Communion at least once each year during the Easter season, which this year extends from the First Sunday of Lent until Trinity Sunday (June 15). The Easter duty of receiving Holy Communion presumes the communicant is in the state of grace (i.e. without mortal sins).

DIVINE MERCY DEVOTIONS will be held again this year on Low (Mercy) Sunday, April 27, after the Latin Mass. In connection with the Divine Mercy Devotion, it is advisable and appropriate to receive the Sacrament of Penance during Lent and before the Mercy celebration.

HOLY WEEK SERVICES (the TRIDUUM) are NOT possible here at St. Thomas for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Please attend them in other churches. *(Father Bonsignore has on-call duty and Hospital Services for those who cannot participate elsewhere.)*

EASTER SUNDAY Masses will be at the usual times; English 9am, and Latin HIGH MASS at 11:15am.

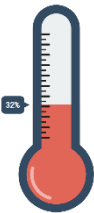

LENTEN OBSERVANCE (REQUIRED MINIMUM)

- ✠ **ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT:** Those who have completed their 14th birthday are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on ALL the Fridays of Lent.
- ✠ **FASTING:** Those between the ages of 18 & 59 (inclusive) are also obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In fasting, one is permitted to eat a single full meal and two other small meals which, when added together, do not equal a full meal and no eating between meals.
- ✠ **OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE:** are encouraged according to one's health and generosity with God. The classic Lenten penitential formula is PRAYER, FASTING, and ALMSGIVING (i.e. works of charity and mercy).
