GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. Practicing Catholics who are spiritually prepared (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a worthy Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary before the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and full of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle. Catholic couples in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament of Matrimony) or in irregular marriages (without the blessing of Christ's Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

NEWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

WATER DOES NOT BREAK YOUR COMMUNION FAST While the weather is hot and the church is uncomfortable, please remember to drink water before Mass to avoid dehydration. You may bring a supply of water to Church for you and your children to drink during Mass; please ensure it is in a container that will not make noise when opened, and please clean up any spills.

QUINCEAÑERA Next Sunday we will hold a special Quinceañera Latin Mass at 11:15pm. This Mass will commemorate the 15th birthday of Giovanna Vargas, a member of our Latin Mass Community and her cousin Isabella Vargas who joins us from Bradenton, Florida. A Quinceañera celebration begins with a Thanksgiving Mass, where the Quinceañeras and their families will give thanks to God for these young women. This is a coming-of-age ceremony where these young ladies are presented to their community as a presentation before God and a promise to honor themselves and their Catholic faith. This Mass of Thanksgiving is a way for their parents to thank God for the blessing of their daughters' lives and to seek God's blessing and guidance as they enter adulthood. The Vargas families invite you to join them in this special ceremony.

CAPITAL REPAIRS FOR THE SUMMER AND FALL We have been addressing our campus' needs for the past two years and have been fortunate to complete some of the necessary work, some by our parishioners and some by businesses. However this year we have a couple of projects that need our immediate attention. First and most important is the new boiler for the Parish Center. We have had three estimates from three reliable HVAC companies. This will cost between \$60,000 to \$65,000. This includes some asbestos removal. In addition there must be semi-annual maintenance contracts that will be over and above this ammount. Secondly, landscaping and topsoil to repair the sewer work done last fall. Due to the difference in elevation between the Parish Center and the parking lot, there is a great amount of topsoil that will be required to level the area and help with the proper drainage. This is also necessary for the middle courtyard. This cost will be approximately \$6,700. Thirdly, the air conditioning in the Church. The air conditioning went out last July. We hired the services of a HVAC consultant to address the Church and Parish Center issues. Estimated cost to replace the air conditioning unit in the Church was estimated to be in the range of \$200,000. This was based on estimates from last fall. We do not see how we can replace the AC at this time. In addition, due to the age of our current heating system in the Church, regular maintenance is very important. We are doing our best to maintain this necessary scheduling. Finally, it will be necessary to ask for your help to pay for the cost of these necessary repairs. You have always been very generous and responsive to my requests regarding other repairs needed and especially the CMA that you have most recently supported. For this I am truly appreciative. If you find it within yourself to help fund either of these expenditures, you can do so by making notation on your check-"Boiler", or "Landscaping". Your support is appreciated. READING I Genesis 18:1-10

Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way." READING II Colossians 1:24-28

The Lord is the strength of his people, the saving refuge of his anointed. Save your people, O Lord, and bless your inheritance; and rule them forever! To you, O Lord, I call; O my God, be not deaf to me, lest, if you heed me not, I become one of those going down into the pit. Glory be to the Father. The Lord.

EPISTLE Rom. 6, 3-11

GOSPEL Mark 8, 1-9

At that time a large crowd was present with Jesus, and again they had nothing to eat. So he summoned the disciples and told them, "My heart is moved to pity for the crowd. For three days now they have been in my company and have nothing left to eat. And if I send them home hungry, they will become weak on the way. Some of them, you know, have come a long distance." But his disciples replied, "How could anyone satisfy these people with bread here in this isolated spot?" Still he asked them, "How many loaves do you have?" "Seven," they replied. Then he directed the crowd to take their places on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, he gave thanks, broke them, and gave them to his disciples to distribute; and they distributed them to the crowd. They also had a few tiny fish; and blessing them, he told them to distribute them also. They are until they were full. Then they gathered up seven hampers of fragments. There were about four thousand in number, and he dismissed them.

Help us to parent our children and grandchildren with a gentle heart as you did.


Show us how to raise our children in faith and bring our families into the Light of Jesus. Remain close to us and help us on our journey to salvation.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. It is possible for emails and texts to *wait* until later!

DRESSING PROPERLY FOR CHURCH Summer brings hot weather, and hot weather brings the need to remind worshippers about proper dress décor in church. Clothing should be neat and modest (un-revealing). No short pants on adults. Shoulders should be covered. Please do NOT "dress down" for Mass, since we are NOT attending a beach party, tennis match, or backyard cook out. Think this through! If you respect the presence of God and your neighbor at church services, you will dress respect-fully. After all, it does matter what we wear to Holy Mass!

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.


