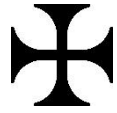

FR. PETER HELFRICH'S GOLDEN JUBILEE OF ORDINATION TO THE SACRED PRIESTHOOD

Today at our Latin High Mass we are celebrating the FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY (JUBILEE) of our Father-Confessor Peter Helfrich.

We are so grateful for his faithful ministry among us with the Sacrament of Penance and with distributing to us the precious Eucharist in Holy Communion.

He has been doing so regularly since May of 2013 at St. Stanislaus.

When the Latin Mass Community moved to its new home at St. Thomas the Apostle in 2014, he came with us and stayed to the present day.

Before 2013, Father did help us on occasion starting in the autumn of 2002.

So, he has been a long-time friend and servant, because of which we have been richly blessed with grace and peace from God.

CONGRATULATIONS, Father Helfrich, and THANK YOU for your HOLY PRIESTHOOD which you have shared with us and others so generously all of these years.

We commend you to the motherly intercession of Our Blessed Lady; Mother of Priests. May you rest secure under the mantle of her LOVE – and ours!

THANKS TO A GENEROUS DONOR, the four entry doors on the church's east side, flanking the Lady Altar, have been professionally cleaned and repainted. Notice how bright and clean they look! And here's a trivia question for the family: What is represented on these doors? What does it mean? This could be an interesting conversation to have on the drive home after Mass.

CMA UPDATE Thru April 21st, we have 58 donors pledging \$20,940 or 43% of our goal of \$49,000. This leaves us a shortfall of approximately \$31,000. The campaign officially ends on May 31st. All pledges must be received by the Diocese by that date. As we have indicated in the past, amounts due at the end must be made up by the parish from our operating funds. If we have to make up the difference from our operating funds, this will not allow us to work on necessary repairs that we have pinpointed for completion this summer and fall. To date we have 50% less donors than we did the past two years. We need everyone's help if we are going to make our goal or at least close the gap. I know that I have asked for your help in the past, and you have answered my call. The current economy is making it difficult for everyone. I can only ask that you do whatever you can. Thank you for your continuing support of the LMC. God Bless You!

MAY CROWNING May 17 followed by a coffee hour reception in the Parish Center. We hope all the first communion students and their families will join us for cake and fellowship after the 11:15 Mass and Crowning.

THE SECOND & THIRD PRECEPTS (COMMANDMENTS/LAWS) of the CHURCH: All Catholics who have reached the age of reason must confess their (mortal) sins in the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year. They must also receive Holy Communion at least once each year during the Easter season, which this year extends from the First Sunday of Lent until Trinity Sunday, May 31. The Easter duty of receiving Holy Communion presumes the communicant is in the state of grace (i.e. without mortal sins).

READING 1 Acts 2:14, 36-41

But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. Let all the house of Israel therefore know assuredly that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?" And Peter said to them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children and to all that are far off, every one whom the Lord our God calls to him." And he testified with many other words and exhorted them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

READING 2 1 Peter 2:20-25

For what credit is it, if when you do wrong and are beaten for it you take it patiently? But if when you do right and suffer for it you take it patiently, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps. He committed no sin; no guile was found on his lips. When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he trusted to him who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For

you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls.

GOSPEL John 10:1-10


“Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door but climbs in by another way, that man is a thief and a robber; but he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. To him the gatekeeper opens; the sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes before them, and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. A stranger they will not follow, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers.” This figure Jesus used with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So Jesus again said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers; but the sheep did not heed them. I am the door; if any one enters by me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *(here all bow)* **AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN.** For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



INTROIT Shout joyfully to God, all you on earth, alleluia; sing praise to the glory of his name, alleluia; proclaim his glorious praise, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Say to God, "How tremendous are your deeds, O Lord! For your great strength your enemies fawn upon you." Glory be to the Father. Shout.

COLLECT Show us the light of your truth, O God, which guides the sinner back to the path of justice. Let those who profess to be Christians avoid whatever will endanger that profession, and follow those things which will help it. Through Jesus Christ.

EPISTLE 1 Peter 2, 11-19

Beloved: I urge you as strangers and wayfarers to avoid fleshly desires which war against the soul. Keep your behavior good among the gentiles, so that from accusing you as wrongdoers, they may, when faced with your good works, glorify God on the day of retribution. Submit to every human institution for the Lord's sake; whether it be the king in his supremacy, or rulers sent by him for the chastisement of wrongdoers and the praise of those who excel. It is the will of God for you to muzzle the ignorance of impious people in this way, by excelling. Submit as free men, who do not make this freedom a veil for wickedness, but who live as God's slaves. Honor all men; love the brotherhood; fear God; honor the king. You who are servants, be subject to your masters in all reverence-not only to the good and considerate, but even to the perverse; for this is a gift from God: in Christ Jesus our Lord.

ALLELUIA Alleluia, alleluia. The Lord has sent deliverance to his people. Alleluia. It behooved Christ to suffer and to rise again from the dead, and so to enter into his glory. Alleluia.

GOSPEL John 16, 16-22

At that time Jesus said to his disciples: "There is just a little while before you lose sight of me, and again a little while before you see me." At this some of his disciples remarked to one another, "What does he mean by this: 'There is just a little while before you lose sight of me, and again a little while before you see me' and 'Because I am going to the Father'?" So they kept saying, "What does he mean by this 'little while'? We don't understand what he is talking about." Since

Jesus knew that they wanted to question him, he said, "You are asking yourselves about my saying, 'There is just a little while before you lose sight of me, and again a little while before you see me.' Truly I assure you, you will weep and go into mourning while the world will rejoice; you will grieve but your grief will be changed to joy. When a woman is in labor, she is in pain since her hour has come. But once the child is born, her joy makes her forget her trial because a man has been born into the world! So you too are in pain now; but I shall see you again, and your hearts will rejoice with a joy that no one can take from you."

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. *It is possible for emails and texts to wait until later!*

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
