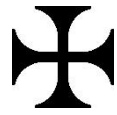

IT'S SPRING CLEANUP TIME This year we are trying something new. Instead of having one cleanup date, we are asking families to work on their own schedules. Please see Help Wanted below.

TODAY WE WILL HOLD THE LAST ENGLISH MASS COFFEE HOUR for the season. These coffee hours will resume when Faith Formation classes start again in the fall. We will continue to have coffee hours after Latin Mass through the summer.

THANKS TO A GENEROUS DONOR, the four entry doors on the church's east side, flanking the Lady Altar, have been professionally cleaned and repainted. Notice how bright and clean they look! And here's a trivia question for the family: What is represented on these doors? What does it mean? This could be an interesting conversation to have on the drive home after Mass.

CMA UPDATE Thru April 28st, we have 60 donors pledging \$21,990 or 45% of our goal of \$49,000. This leaves us a shortfall of approximately \$31,000. The campaign officially ends on May 31st. All pledges must be received by the Diocese by that date. As we have indicated in the past, amounts due at the end must be made up by the parish from our operating funds. If we have to make up the difference from our operating funds, this will not allow us to work on necessary repairs that we have pinpointed for completion this summer and fall. **To date we have 50% less donors than we did the past two years. We need everyone's help if we are going to make our goal or at least close the gap.** I know that I have asked for your help in the past, and you have answered my call. The current economy is making it difficult for everyone. I can only ask that you do whatever you can. Thank you for your continuing support of the LMC. God Bless You!

MAY CROWNING May 17 followed by a coffee hour reception in the Parish Center. We hope all the first communion students and their families will join us for cake and fellowship after the 11:15 Mass and Crowning.

THE SECOND & THIRD PRECEPTS (COMMANDMENTS/LAWS) of the CHURCH: All Catholics who have reached the age of reason must confess their (mortal) sins in the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year. They must also receive Holy Communion at least once each year during the Easter season, which this year extends from the First Sunday of Lent until Trinity Sunday, May 31. The Easter duty of receiving Holy Communion presumes the communicant is in the state of grace (i.e. without mortal sins).

READING 1 Acts 6:1-7

Now in these days when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists murmured against the Hebrews because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. And the twelve summoned the body of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should give up preaching the word of God to serve tables. Therefore, brethren, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this duty. But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." And what they said pleased the whole multitude, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, and Proch'orus, and Nica'nor, and Timon, and Par'menas, and Nicola'us, a proselyte of Antioch. These they set before the apostles, and they prayed and laid their hands upon them. And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith.

Come to him, to that living stone, rejected by men but in God's sight chosen and precious; and like living stones be yourselves built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: "Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and he who believes in him will not be put to shame." To you therefore who believe, he is precious, but for those who do not believe, "The very stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner," and "A stone that will make men stumble, a rock that will make them fall"; for they stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

GOSPEL John 14:1-12

“Let not your hearts be troubled; believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father’s house are many rooms; if it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And when I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way where I am going.” Thomas said to him, “Lord, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?” Jesus said to him, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me. If you had known me, you would have known my Father also; henceforth you know him and have seen him.” Philip said to him, “Lord, show us the Father, and we shall be satisfied.” Jesus said to him, “Have I been with you so long, and yet you do not know me, Philip? He who has seen me has seen the Father; how can you say, ‘Show us the Father’? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father in me; or else believe me for the sake of the works themselves. “Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I go to the Father.


CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. CHURCH ETIQUETTE

WHEN YOU COME TO CHURCH please turn OFF all cell phones, hand-held electronic devices, pagers, watch alarms, etc., and anything else that can disrupt our sacred time with God. *It is possible for emails and texts to wait until later!*

DRESS CODE Please remember to dress appropriately for divine worship: neatly and modestly. Holy Mass is not an occasion when we "dress down" or appear "super-casual"! REVERENCE for God and RESPECT for neighbor should determine what we wear. Think about it. Thank you for your cooperation.

THERE ARE (AT LEAST) THREE REASONS to maintain a prayerful, quiet atmosphere in the church proper before and after services: (1) RESPECT for the House of God, (2) REVERENCE for the Blessed Sacrament, and (3) REGARD for those who want to pray in peace. The guiding principle should be DEVOTION NOT COMMOTION. Please carry on your friendly conversations in the church vestibules (with inside doors closed), outside, or at the coffee hours. Reverence and friendliness can and should co-exist—in their proper settings!

IN ADDITION ...We should make a determined effort to be *on time* for Mass, and we should make the little sacrifice to stay until Mass is over (that is, when the priest-celebrant leaves the sanctuary). When it be necessary to conduct children to the bathroom, please do not travel through the church during the CONSECRATION of the Mass. This will involve only a few moments of delay.
